Background: LSDP were appointed to prepare an Arboricultural Survey & Report, to inform the design process and satisfy Local Authority requirements relating to a proposed scheme of residential development, on land off High Green, Brooke. The report is based on survey information collected in February 2019.

settlement. The site comprises former agricultural land, which is reverting to scrub; the land is bisected by a watercourse / hedgerow and a mixed tree belt has been established along the western edge of the land; the remainder is grassland reverting to scrub.

To the north and west, the site is bordered by open arable land, to the east by the existing settlement; the boundary here is defined by a piecemeal mixture of garden hedges and fences and partly by fragmented lengths of mixed native hedge that are remnants of the former agricultural enclosure. To a mixed native hedgerow, that has had its height managed, but has not been faced up in recent years, resulting in blackthorn thicket encroachment into adjacent areas.

trees are recorded in the survey; the rationale for the categorisation is outlined below - see schedule and drawing for other survey information.
